PERFORMANCE

Students are evaluated on the performance of repertoire from a wide range of eras and styles, as well as etudes or vocalises and orchestral excerpts for string, brass, and wind instruments.

MUSICIANSHP SKILLS

Sight reading and ear training ensures that students develop the skills to learn music independently. Knowledge of music theory is assessed at the Intermediate and Advanced levels only.
